Is the material being burnt wet?			
Is the material suitable to be burnt?			
Has the owner or operator of the property identified all sensitive sites in their area (e.g. schools, daycare centres, hospitals, aged-care facilities)?			
Has the owner or operator of the property checked the weather forecast to ensure the wind direction will not be in the direction of these sites for the period of the burn?			
Have all the local neighbours been notified of the burn? (Neighbours may include public land managers such as the NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service, Forestry Corporation of NSW or the Sydney Catchment Authority, as well as private landowners, Crown Lands and Transport for NSW.)			
Are there any neighbouring areas that are also about to be burnt?			
Has the local fire authority been notified?			
Does the local council require a permit, and if so, has this been issued (e.g. if burning during a designated fire danger period, or within the jurisdiction of Fire and Rescue New South or the Rural Fire Service).			
Is there currently a no-burn order in place for this local district?			
Has a total fire ban day been declared for this region?			
Can the land occupier demonstrate that all recommended steps have been taken to ensure the fire will not go beyond the site boundary?			
Where a boundary is adjacent to Crown land (e.g. a forest or reserve), are extra supervisory conditions required, and is the operator aware of their responsibility to			

ensure their fire does not enter Crown land?
